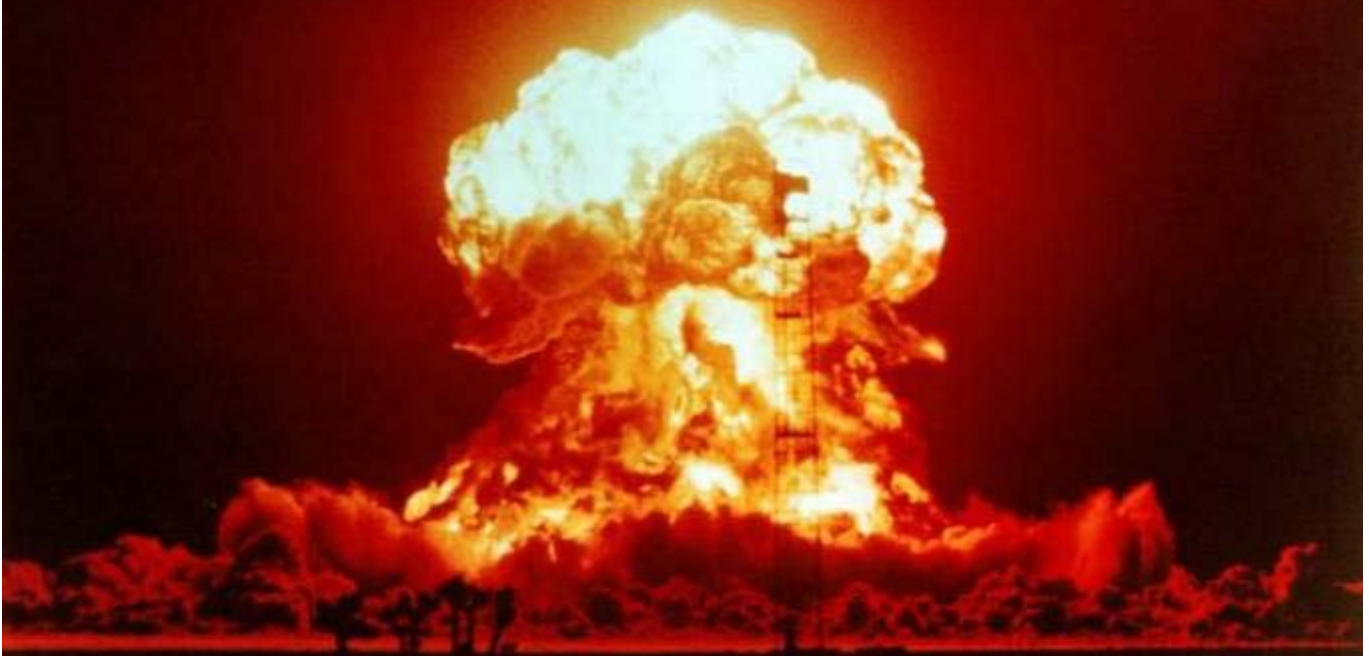


WERE YOU EXPOSED TO IONIZING RADIATION?



VETERANS OF NUCLEAR TESTS AND OPERATIONS MAY BE AT RISK

The National Association of Atomic Veterans, Inc. is a nonprofit veterans service corporation dedicated to assisting an estimated one million U. S. veterans, from all service branches, who were first hand participants in nuclear weapons test detonations, from July 16, 1945 to Nov. 23, 1992. Exposure to ionizing radiation particles has caused severe health anomalies in many of these participants and, in many cases of genetic mutations, to their children.

N.A.A.V., Inc. is also dedicated to assisting military personnel who were assigned to attend nuclear weapons test detonations sponsored by other nations plus the nuclear technicians responsible for the operation and maintenance of nuclear power plants on aircraft carriers or submarines, and veterans who were exposed to Depleted Uranium (DU) munitions during and after the Gulf War.
